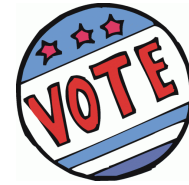

New Interstate Travel Protocols to begin August 11:

- During the July 28 press briefing, Governor Dunleavy announced that starting on August 11, all non-residents must arrive with a negative COVID-19 PCR test taken within 72 hours prior to departure.
- Testing will no longer be available for non-residents when they arrive in Alaska. Residents can still be tested when arriving at the airport. Current protocols will remain in place through August 10.
