City of Coffman Cove Non-Code Ordinance 18 01

AN ORDINANCE DESIGNATING CERTAIN PROPERTY AND EQUIPMENT AS SURPLUS AND AUTHORIZING THE DISPOSITION OF THE SAME TO THE "BY THE SEA" ARTS & SEAFOOD FESTIVAL

WHEREAS, the provisions of the City of Coffman Cove Non-Code Ordinance 12-04 authorizes the sale of supplies, materials, equipment or other personal property, estimated by the Mayor to be in excess of two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500), which are obsolete or no longer required for city purposes may be disposed of as surplus property.

WHEREAS, the Coffman Cove City Council has determined the ownership by the "By the Sea" Arts & Seafood Festival of equipment as follows: one cotton candy machine, one hot dog machine, two cambros, one deep fryer, one 11x17 laminator, two cash registers, eighteen 10x20 tents, one 22x40 tent, one HP wide format color printer, fifty 3x6 tables, eight radios, and one Peavey sound system.

WHEREAS, in the event that the "By the Sea" Arts & Seafood Festival chooses not to continue, the aforementioned existing equipment will revert back to the City of Coffman Cove's possession.

THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE COFFMAN COVE CITY COUNCIL AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Classification.

This is a Non-Code Ordinance.

Section 2. Surplus City equipment and property to be transferred without charge.

The City equipment and property listed above is declared property no longer needed for municipal purposes or public use, and hereby ownership of said equipment is transferred without charge to the "By the Sea" Arts & Seafood Festival.

Section 3. Authority.

The Mayor is hereby authorized to transfer without charge the equipment listed above to the "By the Sea" Arts & Seafood Festival.

Section 4. Effective Date.

This non-code ordinance becomes effective immediately upon its adoption by the City Council.
