The Trans-Alaska pipeline was built because of the discovery of oil at Prudhoe Bay in 1968. The reserves of 9.6 billion barrels of oil are estimated to be 1/3 of the oil reserves of the U.S. When built, the pipeline was the largest privately funded construction effort in history.
