- Arrive with proof of a qualified negative COVID test OR
- Receive a COVID test upon arrival in Alaska, and self-quarantine until results arrive OR
- Self-quarantine for 14 days or the duration of your trip OR
- Follow the work plan that your employer filed with the State of AK.

Kodiak served as Alaska's capital until 1806, when the Russian-American Company, organized in 1799 under charter from the emperor Paul I, moved its headquarters to Sitka, where there was an abundance of sea otters. In 1900, the capital was then moved to Juneau.
